Re: Long Delayed new rail bridge over the Santa Margarita River.

I was wondering what the status of the new rail bridge over the Santa Margarita River north of Oceanside might be. I regularly drive between San Diego and Los Angeles, and I have been watching this project for what seems to be a long, long time. The LOSSAN web site says that construction of the bridge began in 2012, but that does not match my observation. It seems to me that construction actually began in early 2010. I found a SANDAG web site that says the project will be completed by mid-2012. But it is far from completion.

This "appears" to be a project that has no priority – typically, there is nobody at work on the site. With no one working, it will not get done. And this is a key piece of double-tracking the LOSSAN corridor, so it would be good to get the project done. Is it ever going to be completed? Is there a schedule? Jim Geier

The current schedule calls for completion of the bridge by the middle of this year according to this from

I know this project is a year behind schedule and I have been checking it on almost every rail trip north I taken since 2010. There was major flooding just before Christmas 2010 in San Diego County which did a great deal of damage. I haven't found anything official but I know of reports that much of the work of the first year of construction was washed away by this flooding. I've also read unofficially that the project was largely redesigned because of the flood damage. Large parts of Camp Pendleton are a nature reserve and I know there are restrictions on use of the base during mating season of an endangered bird species. I don't know if this affected this project but it did for the nearby San Mateos Creek Bridge during the fall and winter months. NB
