Fresno Moving to Tear up Historic Pedestrian Mall

City officials say the reconstructed street would be pedestrian- and environment-friendly, with just two lanes of traffic, 25-ft. wide sidewalks, and public artwork. And with high speed rail construction slated to begin shortly, a station is planned just a block from the mall.

Perris Valley Line gets green light

Work is expected to get underway in about two months on the 24-mile Perris Valley Line after a federal official Tuesday, Oct. 1, cleared the way for the project.

"Construction will definitely start this year," said John Standiford, deputy executive director for the Riverside County Transportation Commission, in a telephone interview Tuesday.

The project will extend Metrolink's Los Angeles-to-Riverside service southeast to Perris. Upon completion in 2015, trains running on the 91 Line would continue to the south end of Perris through north Riverside and Moreno Valley.
