

Cao focused his research on the Hiawatha light rail line in Minneapolis (lately called the Blue line instead). The line runs 12 miles between the downtown area and the Mall of America, carrying travelers to major sports stadiums, entertainment districts, and the international airport.

The real game changer for the economically challenged in the San Joaquin Valley won't by California High Speed Rail. It'll be well-run traditional rail modeled after the Altamont Corridor Express service. That's because high speed rail will serve one of three classes: Upper income super-distance commuters, tourists, and Los Angeles to San Francisco business travel.

ACE-style service targets traditional commuters, regional entertainment travel, and the poor. That's right. The poor.

The SNCF, operator of the TGV has gone to great lengths to offer discount ticket and extensive service in France to insure everyone can ride High Speed Rail. ACE is not in competition with High Speed Rail, but will benefit from it with transferring riders to and from High Speed Rail. The larger cities in the San Joaquin Valley understand what High Speed Rail can do for their local development. But more work is needed to insure the smaller towns in the Valley are not left out and ignored. High Speed Rail needs all the support they can get if it is to get built. NB
