



This is a graphic of the track projects planned or soon to built on the LOSSAN Corridor. San Diego County now has about 54 percent of its 60 miles of railroad double tracked. In 2014 just over 2 additional miles of double track will be added in San Diego County with construction started on 7 miles of additional double tracking. Projects to get 97 percent double tracking in San Diego County have funding for 73 percent of construction as of now.





"It's sounding like everyone's been a little overly optimistic about how the city of Santa Clara is going to handle the estimated 18,000+ cars that will arrive in town on game days once the 49ers kick off their 2014-15 season. There's been a lot of talk about the "ample" number of parking spaces available near the stadium, but almost none of that parking is stadium-specific, and a lot of it belongs to neighboring businesses that will make parking for Monday night football games impossible."

This might not be such a good example after all, as apparently, the nearby VTA and ACE/Capitol Corridor stations with shuttles won't be enough to convince enough fans to get out of their cars when going to the game to have a weeknight game. This issue might even be worth an article on its own to discuss where planning went wrong and what might be tried to address it.

I stand by what I said about the new 49er's Levi Stadium. When some people hear about plans to build a major stadium depending on rail transit; the first thing they complain about is people won't take the trains and there won't be enough parking. These were the same complaints when PETCO Park was built in San Diego. Parking is limited in this part of San Diego. I have lived in San Diego County for about 25 years. I remember the opposition to PETCO Park because of its location and limited parking. Parking has never been a problem at PETCO Park. I remember that after the first baseball season at PETCO Park which set attendance records compared to the recent past, it was found that there was in fact surplus parking all baseball season long with Trolley and Coaster ridership higher than expected.

Camden Yards in Baltimore 20 years ago was the first new baseball stadium since the 1940's built in an urban area without direct freeway connections and massive parking lots. It was a major success as an anchor for redeveloping the area around the harbor in Baltimore and as a popular stadium. Other team owners took notice of this and became interested in similar projects for their teams in large part for income from commercial land development. In California we have seen this model work in San Francisco for the new Giant's stadium and in San Diego. If we look back at the past the Los Angeles Coliseum was enlarged in 1932 to hold over 101,000 people for the Olympics. The Coliseum was often full between 1932 through the early 1960's with limited parking. Back then most people got the the Coliseum by Streetcar. Today the Expo Line is increasingly popular now as a way to get to events at the Coliseum NB
